- Romans 10:13 "For whosoever shall **call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved** (rescued, delivered)."





First, the Bad News . . .

The Problem - SIN

Psalm 51:5 - "Behold, I was shapen in iniquity; and in sin did my mother conceive me."

Romans 3:10 - "... there is none righteous, no, not one."

Romans 3:23 - "For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God."

God is holy and without sin. God is so holy and pure that He cannot even look at sin or be in the presence of sin. God's dwelling place (heaven) is also pure and without sin. God has declared that no sin will or can enter heaven. How then can I, a sinner, have a personal relationship with God, and go to heaven one day?

The Penalty - Death & Separation from God Forever

Romans 5:12 - " . . . death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned."

Romans 6:23 - "For the wages of sin is death . . . "

Hebrews 9:27 - "And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment."

Revelation 20:15 - "And whosoever was not found written in the book of life was cast into the lake of fire."

The wages (or earnings) of sin is death. No sin or sinner can enter God's dwelling place (heaven) or even hope of having a personal relationship with Him. No amount of good works or deeds can remove my sins. What shall I do!?

SESSION 1

SO VERY SWEET . . . TREASURED TRIALS TOLD

Though many Old Testament characters experienced deep trials, Job requested God that his WORDS would be penned. **Job 19:23**, "Oh that my words were now written! Oh that they were printed in a book!" God honored his request, thus, the Book of Job comprises of 42 chapters in the Word of God. Twenty of the 42 chapters are only Job's spoken words.

The first words that Job spoke are found in Job 1:21.

"Naked came I out of my mother's womb, and naked shall I return thither: the LORD gave, and the LORD hath taken away; blessed be the name of the LORD."

Job's History

The Seminar theme is centered on the topic of WORDS and the Book of Job is centered on WORDS: The Words of God, the Words of Job, the Words of Satan, The Words of Job's Wife, The Words of Job's Friends. We will see WHO has the last Word!

Before Job spoke any WORDS in the Book of Job, he had experienced the most devastating trial he had ever experienced and he did not know WHY but He knew God.

I journal as a mean of recording what God is doing in my life, but on the days I don't journal does NOT mean He is not working . . . for we know the LORD is always and daily working in our life.

- 3. Journal what blesses and uplifts your heart: A Scripture verse or passage or word study you did; A word from a friend; A devotion you read; Words from a book you are reading; A thought from the preaching of the Word; A marvel of God's Creation beauty; A Song that has encouraged your heart.
- 4. Journal how you feel on good days and bad days. On the good days elaborate and bad days briefly explain. If on a bad day, the Lord gives you something that uplifts your eyes to Him, write it down . . . it is always a wonderful reminder just when we need it the most!
- 5. Journal your thoughts. Our thinking is not always RIGHT thinking. Journaling has helped me see the errors of my thinking and often led me to do a Bible study to correct my thinking to look to the LORD for hope in discouragement. Often journaling our thoughts can help us evaluate what it True and what is False. Remember the Bible is our authority to right thinking.
- 6. Journal words of PRAISE to the LORD . . . words of gratitude and thanksgiving. Keeping a daily journal to say "Thank You" to the Lord is a help to keep our hearts and minds focused on Him.
- 7. Journal your prayers . . . your hearts cry to the LORD for yourself and for others.

Allow Journaling to be a blessing to you, NOT a burden. Journaling is to Not be stressful, but can be strengthening in our faith walk and relationships. Journaling can help us in our life's journey to keep our focus on the LORD.



It is better to OBSERVE our words on this side of eternity, than wait until we see Jesus face to face and have to give an accounting to Him for our every word.

without the bees attacking, lowering the risk of getting stung or attacked.

Satan is called the angel of light, but works in the darkness. Others will not understand our trial and may attack us. Satan twists and distorts WORDS to swiftly kill relationships, paralyze love, poison minds, destroy faith, stain purity and deface reputations.

Our defense against Satan is to be robed in the righteousness of Christ and walk obediently in the light of His WORDS. Our defense is the LORD. We are to PUT ON His characteristics. Only His mercy and grace can sustain us day by day IN the Trial. The answers will come in God's timing and in His way. Our part is to fully trust the Lord Jesus as our Protector and Defender.

4. God's Supply for Survival

The most obvious and well-known reason bees build comb homes is as a place to create and store honey. Honey is an essential resource for the bee, particularly if they are to <u>survive the winter months</u>. During the cold months, bees are unable to venture away from the hive to gather nectar and pollen. They are, therefore, reliant on the honey resources they have built up within the hive, as they form the "winter cluster".

What we need in our trials is the WORDS of God. The Bible is our source of food to feed upon for our survival. God's Words give us wisdom to observe and be restored. His Word give us direction how to be humbled and strengthened through the Trial.

5. Gathering the HONEY . . . our WORDS of testimony!

The Honey bee's have flown back and forth from the flowers to the comb with a load of nectar heavier than themselves. It has taken honeybee workers ten million trips to gather enough nectar to make one pound of honey. Now it is the Bee keeper's job to gather the honey!

Ladies, and teens: God is seeking to give us something sweeter than honey. He is working IN our lives so He can speak THROUGH our lives Truths Triumphant Testimony.

There is coming a day when the LORD will gather us home to heaven. May we look forward to hearing Jesus sweet WORDS, "Well done, My good and faithful servant."

Bee Outfit/Honeycomb/Jar of Honey

Illustrating with HONEY what God has taught us from Job's life.

As Honey is a Treasure, Trials can be a Treasure

God created sweet things for us to enjoy. He created honeybees to make honey. The object of the beekeeper is to get the treasure of honey from the honeycomb.

Bees make honey from the nectar they collect which contains vitamins, minerals and enzymes that our bodies require. This nectar is preserved in the honeycomb to protect it from loss of nutrients that helps build our bones, as well as, have other health benefits for us. When experiencing a Trial we need to trust the Lord for the benefits we will learn and gain. For that is the treasure.

2. The Choice: Wise or Foolish!

Today's beekeepers wear a <u>protective outfit:</u> a hooded veil, full-body overalls, and gloves. This is not a REAL beekeepers outfit, it is a kids pretend costume!

A <u>beekeeping suit</u> is thick and is intended to reduce the odds of stingers reaching the of the beekeeper skin. A honey bee's stinger is normally around 1.6 millimeters long. The beekeeper suit allows them to operate more quietly and slowly, which is crucial. If you make a lot of fast movements around the bees, they will get easily irritated and aggressive and you could get stung!

Just as beekeepers can be stung, we will feel the pain and hurt of our trial.

At that point we have a CHOICE: To be wise. To trust the Lord and learn from Him and gain the treasured truth OR be foolish and reject His Word and miss discovering the Treasure.

3. Walk in the Light

Bees defend themselves against predators who harm them, wishing to consume their tasty honey and attacking the beehive in order to do so. The majority of these animals happen to be dark in color. As a result, bees are considered to have learned to detest dark-colored creatures approaching their hives. As a result, by wearing white, a beekeeper may approach and open the hive

After each of Job's three friends spoke, Job spoke for a total of 20 chapters.

Job spoke in Chapters 3, 6-7; 9-10; 12-14; 16-17; 19; 21-24; 26-31.

SPEAKS to Job's Words When the LORD spoke to Job of His majesty and greatness, it humbled Job and brought him to silence. Until we are silent before God, He cannot SPEAK.
Job's reactions. "I am " - I am insignificant and unworthy and I am silenced." Job had told his friends to cover their mouth in
